



Community Group Study: God's Word is Final
Psalm 19 | week of September 1

GETTING STARTED

- What is the most amazing thing you've seen in nature? What did you conclude about God as you gazed on his creation?

Read Psalm 19.

DISCUSSION

- Who wrote this Psalm? What do you know about this man? Why would he write about how the heavens reveal God to man?
- Who has the opportunity to view God's handiwork? Do you know people who deny God's existence? Why do they not believe that God exists? How can you use Psalm 19 to share the truth of God's existence with them?
- How is God revealed through Scripture? What has he told man about himself through the written word? Why is nature alone not enough to help man fully understand God?
- What nouns are used to define (name) God's word in verses 7-11? What do these names for God's Word tell us about God's authority? Who establishes truth and defines right and wrong?
- What adjectives are used to describe God's Word in verses 7-11? What do these descriptions tell us about God?
- Re-read Psalm 19:12-14. What is the proper response to God as he reveals himself through nature and his Word?
- How has God demonstrated that he is Redeemer in your life? What has God redeemed you from?

Application

- What type of hidden sin can you repent of like described in vs. 12?
- What kinds of presumptuous sin can you repent of as described in vs. 13?
- Psalm 19 isn't really about just reading your Bible more, but rather describing complete satisfaction in the Word. How can you pray that you would desire his Word more than much fine gold or find it sweeter than honey?

Next Steps

- Because I value the Word of God, I will set aside time to read, study, and learn about it beginning this week.
- I will adopt this prayer: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O LORD."
