COMMUNITY GROUP QUESTIONS

Reflective Questions for You and Your Small Group

1. Revisit the historical context of the book of Zechariah and discuss why it was so powerful for the prophet to receive the revelation of 6:9-15 when he did. (For help, see <https://www.gotquestions.org/Book-of-Zechariah.html>).
2. In the sermon we explored the Christological overtones and typology in Zechariah 6. Reflecting on this, discuss why it was important that Jesus was a descendant of Abraham? Why was it important that Jesus was a descendant of David the son of Jesse, the Bethlehemite? 3. Why is it important for our salvation that Jesus is the High Priest and King of His redeemed people? (for help, see <https://www.gotquestions.org/Jesus-prophet-priest-king.html>). How does the current priesthood and coming kingship of Christ practically inform and shape your faith, drawing you closer to Him by the Spirit and to His Father?
4. In the sermon we reflected on the doctrines of the humiliation and exaltation of the Son incarnate. Discuss how the humiliation of the Son encourages and humbles your faith, life, relationships, and service to others. Discuss how the exaltation of the Son does the same for you and draws you into worshipping the exalted Son who is Lord of the earth and His people.
5. When it comes to your lost friends, family members, and those around you, what would you say the most dominant view of Jesus is among them? Who do they erroneously think Jesus is and how might/do they argue when presented with the true Jesus of the Bible and reasons for believing in Him?
6. How can you be more active in sharing the gospel with the lost? How can we pray with you for boldness in this area and hold you accountable?
7. While our passage on Sunday was somewhat cosmic and mystical, how can you practically apply it to your life in a tangible way? What does this text tell you about God's law and His gospel? How does it call you to action?
