The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty (Matt. 6:9), Creator of heaven and earth (Gen. 1–2).

And [I believe] in Jesus Christ, His only Son Our Lord (Rom. 1:3–4; 10:9).

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary (Matt. 1:18–25).

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the *dead* [hades] (Matt. 27:11–56; Lk. 23:26–56).

On the third day He rose again from the dead (Matt. 29:1–20). He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father (Acts 1:1–11). He will come again to judge the living and the dead (Matt. 25:31–46).

I believe in the Holy Spirit (John 14:25–27), the holy *catholic* [*universal*] church (1 Cor. 12:4–31), the communion of saints (Eph. 4:11–16), the forgiveness of sins (2 Cor. 5:18–21), the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting (1 Cor. 15).
