Missionary Toolbox: Richness of the Indwelling Word

- 1) The Bible's depth is unfathomable. Its height is unreachable. Its breadth is limitless. Yet it makes wise the simple and is written so every believer can comprehend it but never stop learning and growing.
- 2) The Bible demands our meditation, not just a nod of acknowledgement.
- 3) The Bible by faith must reach into every area of our Christianity. Without it - prayer, fellowship, service, worship, love – all of these become dead works.
- **4)** The Bible is the Holy Spirit's sword. Dwelling in God's word is the key to a life of abundance and joy.
