

STUDY #1 – EYES UP – HEBREWS 2:1-4 SEPTEMBER 13-19, 2020

Our spiritual life will be determined by where we look – keep our eyes up on Jesus! We begin our study by digging into the picture of where we look. Where is it that we are to focus our attention? It is upon Jesus. In this message we will learn about the writers desire for us to “pay more careful attention.”

Bible Study

Read Hebrews 2:1-4 in two different translations

1. Ask someone in your group to summarize this passage in a phrase or sentence.
2. According to the writer of Hebrews, to what are we to pay attention? When he uses this phrase “to what we have heard,” who was speaking so they could hear? You can also read Hebrews 1:1-4 to gain a better picture.
3. What is the answer to the rhetorical question in verse 3?
4. Why does the writer refer back to the OT Law given to the Israelites? How would this apply to us today?
5. How do we “hear” from Jesus today?
6. Why is it so important to the writer that we “pay more careful attention” to Jesus? When you hear the phrase “drift away” what picture comes to your mind? How should we apply this picture to our spiritual walk with Jesus?

Application

- At what points in your life might you be tempted to “drift away?” Share with the group one thing that takes your focus away from keeping your eyes on Jesus? What is one thing you will do this week to eliminate that distraction?
- What helps you to have your “eyes up” on Jesus this week?
